
THE COOPERATIVE EXTENSION

Eligibility Requirements

Academically qualified with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 based on a 4.0 scale at the time of application.

Currently accepted or enrolled in a four-year accredited college or university in a course of study relevant to the work of Cooperative Extension.

Full-time juniors, seniors or graduate students at the time of the internship.

Continuing their education in the fall following their internship.

In possession of a valid driver's license and personal vehicle.

Eligible to work in the United States.


