Eligibility Requirements

- ✓ *Academically qualified with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 based on a 4.0 scale at the time of application.*
- ✓ *Currently accepted or enrolled in a four-year accredited college or university in a course of study relevant to the work of Cooperative Extension.*
- ✓ *Full-time juniors, seniors or graduate students at the time of the internship.*
- ✓ *Continuing their education in the fall following their internship.*
- ✓ *In possession of a valid driver's license and personal vehicle.*
- ✓ *Eligible to work in the United States.*

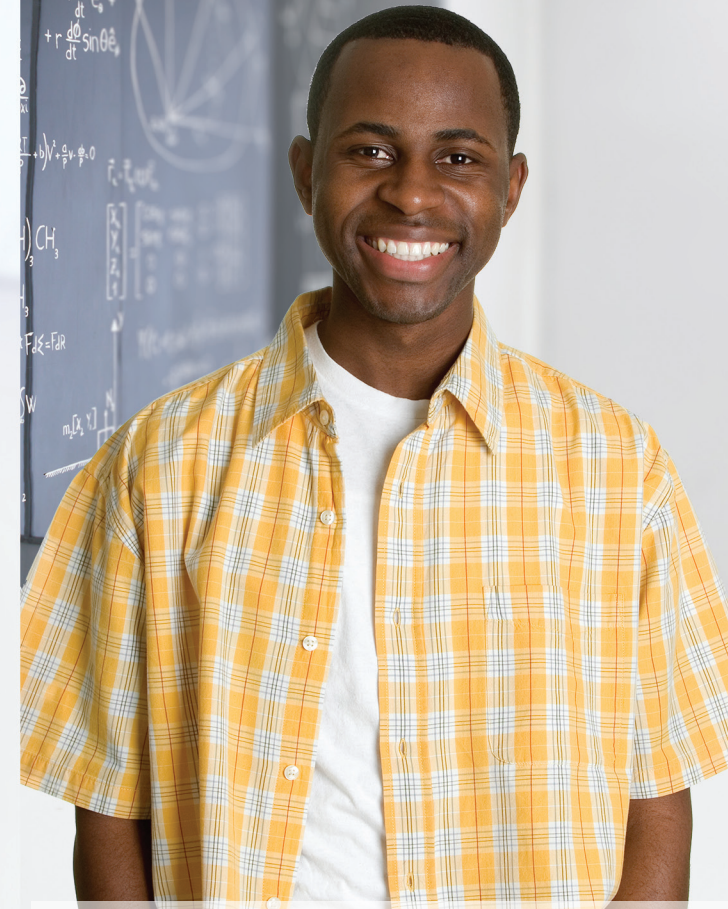
