Getting to Know Your Woodlands

Southern forests are among the most diverse and productive in the world, ranging from natural stands of hardwood, cypress, and pines, to human-planted pines and hardwoods. Learn how natural and planted woodlands have shaped the forest ecology and the importance of this knowledge when developing management plans and planning practices for the future of your forest.

Managing Your Woodlands

Learn the basics of pine and hardwood management with tips on managing for the future. Topics include growing and managing pines, from site selection to final harvest; evaluating existing hardwood stands, and basic decisions on future management; how to identify degraded hardwood stands, acceptable growing stock, and assess available options to make degraded hardwood stands more desirable, profitable and sustainable.

Identifying and Managing Woodland Threats

Disease, insects and invasive plants all pose threats to woodlands. In this session, a team of experts will introduce participants to a few basic pest principles, present a model example of each threat, and offer some simple practices to help ensure woodlands remain healthy and productive.

Wildlife and Woodlands

Managing wildlife is often ranked as a primary objective among landowners. This session will introduce participants to basic wildlife management principles and concepts, and provide information on habitat requirements of various species.
